## **CGS Atrium Newsletter ~ Lent, March 2006**

**We have entered into a new liturgical year** with the celebration of Advent and then of Christmas and Epiphany with the children. We have seen the changing of the liturgical seasons and have enjoyed the return to Ordinary time, a time to reflect on the gift of the great Feast of Christmas when the Light came to live among us. We ponder the Infancy Narratives together: the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Adoration of the Shepherds and the Magi, and for the third year children, the Presentation in the Temple as well.

We are turning now to contemplate the Parables of the Kingdom of God: the parable of the Mustard Seed, the parable of the Merchant and the Pearl, and (for the older children) the parable of the Leaven. We will also be meditating on the parable of the Grain of Wheat as Lent begins and we begin our preparation time for the Feast of Easter.

During this past interval of Ordinary time we have also dwelt more in depth on the Mass: the nomenclature of the altar area, the vestments of the priest, and the gestures which the priest uses during Mass. The children will be learning or revisiting the gestures of Epiclesis, the Preparation of the Chalice, the Offering, the Sign of the Cross, Genuflection, etc. Given the richness of their exposure, this will be a great time to talk with your child about what he or she sees at Mass. Noticing what color the chasuble is and the various items used at Mass such as the chalice, paten, candlesticks, crucifix, altar cloth and so forth will be familiar to

the child even in the first year in the Atrium.

Once a week during the Atrium time is enough to begin to help the child to contemplate these riches but the Spirit at work in them is always active. We sometimes sing a beautiful song with them, "Be Still and Know that I am God," and talk about the value of Silence in order to hear God's voice. The Atrium experience will be greatly enriched for your child if you also find opportunities to share these treasures with them.
